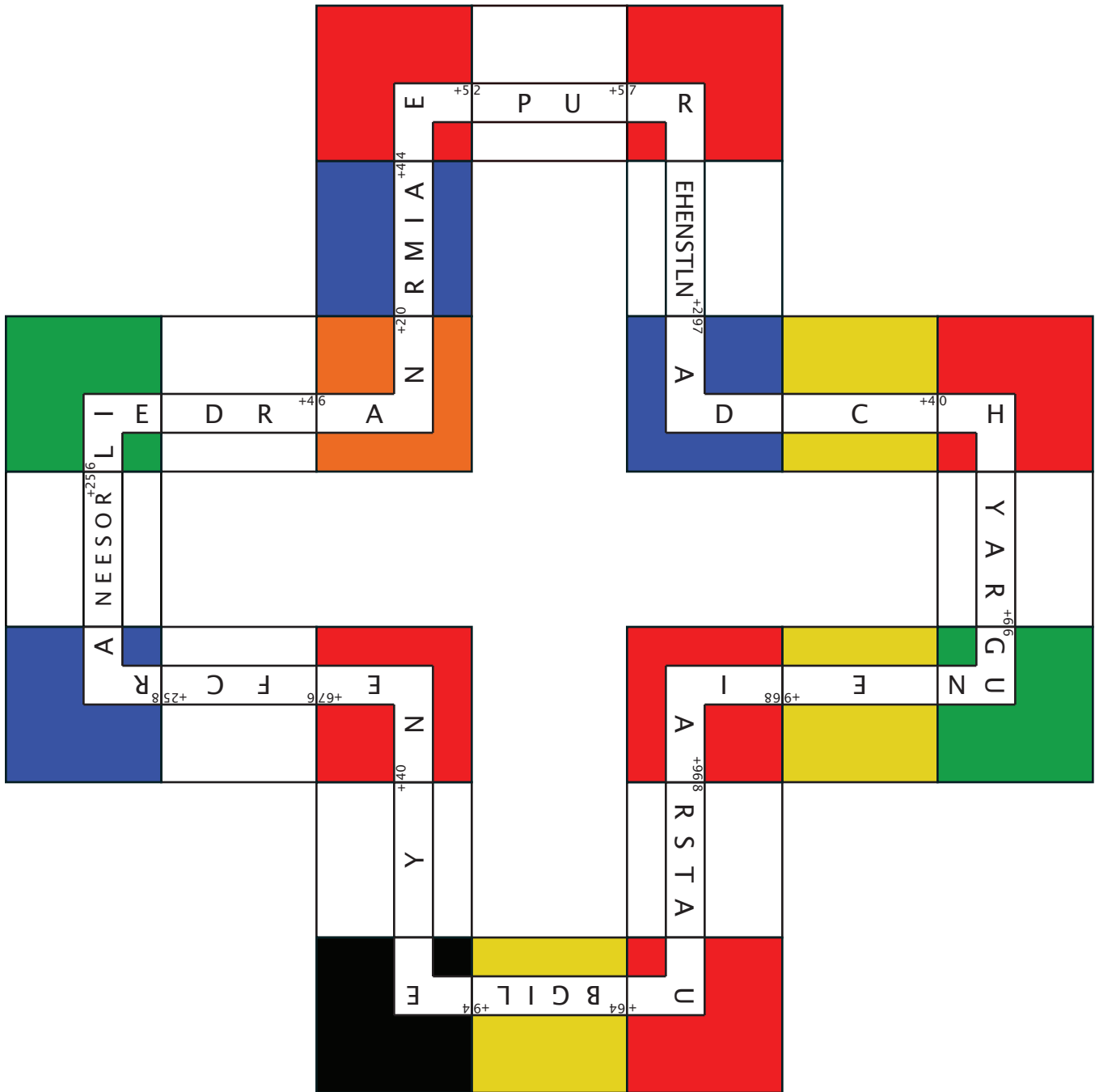


## Solution to Clue #2



These are the assembled foam pieces. Each group of three pieces forms a country flag, oriented correctly in either the horizontal or vertical direction. In addition, the letters found on each set of three pieces anagram to that country's name. After assembling the pieces, read the country codes off, starting at +57 (Colombia) and take the first letters to get CARTOON ART MUSEUM.

By far the most common mistake is to invert the board, giving you unreadable country codes. This board looks almost right in this configuration, but either the horizontal or vertical flags will all be flipped (depending on how you look at it).

Note: We had two difficulty levels in this game. The NORMAL teams got a list of the twelve countries whose flags are represented in this structure, while the CRAZY (hard) teams had to figure those out for themselves.

Note 2: If giving out the list of country codes felt stupid, it was made necessary by the fact that sometime after 2005, almanacs stopped putting country codes in. We emailed the World Almanac, but didn't get any response. Anyone have any idea why they'd take these out?
